Subject: -Immediate Intervention to stop RED (WR) from processing eviction of AAI staff from officially occupied Quarters-AAI staff denied natural justice – Formal Notice for Agitation - reg.

Dear Sir,

We feel very painful & humiliation as the AAI Employees of CSI Airport, Mumbai are going through a worst tense situation, which forced us to draw your kind attention on above said burning issue and request for your kind and immediate intervention to stop RED (WR) from processing eviction of AAI staff from officially occupied AAI Quarters.

In this regard we hereby submit that the serving AAI Employees have been officially allotted to occupy the departmental quarters and as long as they are in the services of AAI they will continue to occupy any such quarter allotted to them. Either the AAI Employees in occupation have breached any terms of conditions or there have been any illegality committed by occupants.

Under such circumstances the AAI Management of Regional Headquarters acting in inhuman manner by keep issuing notices and ultimately calling it "**Final Notice**" wherein threatening to evict the AAI Employees by calling their occupation as unauthorized is not only illegal and unwarranted it amounts to an act of irresponsibility.

We further submit that Indian Airports Kamgar Union represented Industrial Dispute between AAI & MIAL management and IAKU with regard to the clauses of OMDA pertaining to the service conditions of AAI Employees of CSI Airport, Mumbai is pending before the Hon'ble Central Government Industrial Tribunal cum Labour Court at Mumbai after it is referred by an Appropriate Government i.e., Govt. of India. Also further that the Hon'ble Division Bench of Bombay High Court at Mumbai in L.P.A. No.

117/2009 in Writ Petition No. 9004/2009 held that **"There is no possibility of employees suffering any irreparable injury because of the transfer, because if ultimately the tribunal finds in their favour, they can be re-posted to their previous place"** has been upheld by the Honourable Supreme Court.

On the other hand if the AAI employees would have been absorbed in the services of MIAL as per terms of OMDA then there they should have been continued to be occupied said accommodation as such they were continued to enjoy same terms and conditions as they were enjoying in AAI, since issue is under the process of Industrial Adjudication.

Moreover your good-self kindly aware that Mumbai being commercial capital of India, it is beyond any bodies imagination that such large number of employees with their family members to find any alternate accommodation within their capacity. Also it is evident that the AAI Employees at CSI Airport, Mumbai have been regularly pleading before the authorities to consider their grievances sympathetically, which went as cry in wilderness.

It is therefore your good-self's personal and an immediate intervention is solicited. The delay may cause unrest among the affected employees and we may force to adopt agitation methods, hence this letter may please be treated as appropriate notice.
